Submission Guidelines:

- The paper should consist of 5,000 - 10,000 words, inclusive of footnotes.
- Comments and notes should consist of 4,000 - 6,000 words, inclusive of footnotes.
- Book reviews should consist of 1,000 - 2000 words, inclusive of footnotes.
- Font - Times New Roman; Size 12 for Text, 10 for Footnotes.
- Line spacing - 1.5 for text and single for footnotes.
- Microsoft Word Document Format.
- The submission should have an attached cover page with the Author's brief description including Title, Name, University/Organization, Educational qualification, Professional Status, in not more than 300 words.
- Apart from the cover page, the rest of the submission should not contain any reference to the identity of the author in order to enable anonymous peer-review.
- For citation and references, "Indian Law Institute, Rules of Footnoting" should be followed. Authors may visit freely accessible website of Indian Law Institute <http://www.ili.ac.in/footnoting12.pdf>
- The submissions may be sent at jclc@clc.du.ac.in as an attachment in the electronic form.
