### ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

#### AUGUST 10, 2017




It is said that a good beginning always makes a big difference. An orientation programme marks the start of new and exciting beginning. It works towards encouraging the students and provides them an insight about the campus environment. The Academic Year 2017-2018 began with an Orientation Programme for new students which was held on August 10, 2017 in the Auditorium, Campus Law Centre and was divided into three sessions.

## Session I- Inaugural



The programme commenced with the lighting of ceremonial lamp by our distinguished guests. This was followed by felicitation of guests by our respected Professor-in-Charge, CLC, Professor (Dr.) Usha Tandon. Professor (Dr.) Usha Tandon delivered the welcome address and introduced the guests to the students. Following this, Professor Ved Kumari, Head and Dean, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi addressed the gathering and highlighted the role of teachers in inculcating values among students.



Thereafter, the Guest of Honour, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Jayant Nath, Judge, High Court of Delhi addressed the students. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Jayant Nath acclaimed CLC by telling the new entrants about CLC alumni in Supreme Court of India, Delhi High Court, other High Courts, bureaucracy, diplomacy etc. He shared his experience at CLC and emphasised on the importance of case law method of teaching. He further encouraged the students to involve

themselves in moot court competitions to develop skills of advocacy.

This was followed by the address of the Chief Guest Hon'ble Mr. Justice Swatanter Kumar, Chairperson, National Green Tribunal. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Swatanter Kumar shared fond memories of his college days and advised the students to make best use of the resources available to them. He apprised the students about the importance of internships to gain exposure to the practical aspect of law and highlighted the internship programme of the National Green Tribunal.



He also emphasised on the importance of moot court competitions and mentioned about various fields of law and its future prospects.

The session ended with the Vote of Thanks delivered by Sh. S.K. Gupta, Associate Professor and Teacher Convenor, Orientation Committee.



## Session II- About CLC

The second session started with felicitation of Teacher Convenors of various Committees of CLC by Professor (Dr.) Usha Tandon, Professor-in-Charge, CLC. This was followed by her

address where she gave a brief account to the students of their stay at CLC and enlightened the students about the working of various Committees such as Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee; Anti-Ragging Committee; Differently Abled Persons Committee, Development and Maintenance Committee and Student Union Advisory Committee. She apprised the students for attendance requirements and asked the students to be regular and punctual for their classes. She also highlighted that classes are strictly held as per the official time table provided by the office. She said that a student can any time come to her office, if there is any problem regarding classes.



Sh. S.K. Gupta, Associate Professor and Teacher Convenor, Orientation Committee gave an insight of the history of CLC and informed the students about the various facilities available. He also highlighted the accomplishments of the alumni of CLC.

Mr. Parikshet Sirohi, Assistant Professor and Teacher Convenor, Moot Court Society (MCS) apprised the students about the working of the society and its Student Executive Council. He outlined the events organised by MCS specifically the K.K. Luthra Memorial Moot Court Competition and highlighted the achievements of the students in various Moot Court competitions. Dr. Anju Sinha, Assistant Professor and Teacher Convenor, Legal Aid Society explained the need and importance of legal aid to students. She underlined the events organised by the society and the initiatives undertaken by DSLSA.

Ms. Shilpi, Assistant Professor and Teacher Convenor, Discussions Society made the students aware about the significance of debates and discussions. She emphasised on the students weekly presentations organised by the society which promotes the culture of discussion and research in CLC. Dr. Monica Chaudhary, Assistant Professor and Teacher

Convenor, Placement Assistance Council (PAC), informed the students about the functioning of the society and the challenges faced. She explained the procedure for CV verification and registration of the students who intend to secure internships and jobs through PAC. Sh. Rajesh Singh, Deputy Librarian introduced to the students the facilities available at the CLC Library. He detailed out the procedure for membership of the Library and talked about various online resources available in the library. The session ended with a Vote of Thanks delivered by Ms. Isha Wadhwa, Assistant Professor, CLC.



### **Session III- Moot Court Demonstration**

The third session was a Moot Court Demonstration by the Moot Court Society. It was organised with an intent to provide the first-year students an opportunity to observe the procedure of Moot Court Competitions. The Orientation began with a power point presentation discussing the basics of mooting. The presentation dealt in detail with the methodology to research and also discussed the rules and regulations of the Moot Court Competitions. The Presentation was followed by the Demonstration of Moot Court; the arguments revolved around whether BCCI is a State or not. It was judged by the alumnus of CLC, Mr. Parikshit Ahuja, Advocate, Supreme Court of India, where he asked the speakers' questions based on their arguments. The Members of Executive Council along with Mr. Parikshit Ahuja, took up the queries of the first-year students.
