Objectives of the Workshop

- To give law students a practical understanding of how the Criminal Justice System works – right from **Investigation to Judgment**
- To provide exposure to **Police Investigation Techniques, Forensic Science methods**, and **Client Counseling**
- To develop **Moot Court Advocacy skills** such as **Drafting, Research** and **Oral Submissions**
- To develop students **Judicial Reasoning** and **Decision-Making** skills through structured Judgment Writing exercises.
- To promote teamwork, critical thinking, and experiential learning

Structure of the Workshop

Day-1 (15-September-2025)

Phase I: Crime Scene & Police Investigation

- A **Crime Scene** is staged (e.g., a Murder in a hostel room, theft in a library, or cybercrime case).
- **Police Team Tasks:**
 - Draft and register FIR.
 - Inspect Crime Scene.
 - Collect witness statements.
 - Arrest suspects.
- **Forensic Team Tasks:**
 - Collect Physical Evidence (fingerprints, blood stains, weapon, and documents).
 - Prepare Forensic Analysis Report.
- **Output Documents:** FIR, Investigation Report, Forensic Report, Charge Sheet/ Final Report.

Phase II: Client Counseling & Legal Drafting

- The **Accused** will Consult and interact with the Student Advocates
- **Advocate Role:**
 - Conduct client interview.
 - Identify Legal Issues.
 - Prepare documents: Complaint, Bail Application, Charge Sheet, etc.

Day-2 (16-September-2025)

Phase III: Moot Court Trial Advocacy

- **Courtroom Setup:** Judge's bench, Advocates' tables, Witness box.
- **Roles:**
 - Prosecution Team presents charges & evidence.
 - Defense Team argues for accused Bail.
 - Judges preside & ask questions.

Phase IV: Judgment Writing

- After the Trial, Judges (Participants of Judgment Writing Competition) prepare a reasoned Judgment.
- **Judgment must contain:**
 - Brief facts of the case
 - Issues for consideration
 - Findings based on evidence
 - Application of Legal Provisions & Precedents
 - Final Order (conviction/acquittal, direction)

Venue Plan

- **Crime Scene Setup:** MPH/ Atrium/Library with props (crime tape, dummy knife, fake blood).
- **Client Counseling:** Auditorium (tables for one-on-one interaction).
- **Moot Court Trial Advocacy:** Auditorium.
- **Judgment Writing:** G3/ Classrooms
